

Year 1 Autumn Term Homework Expectation

Outlined below are the homework expectations for this half term.

Reading

Research shows that the more exposure your child has to reading, the more academically able they will be. We recommend and encourage all children to read or be read to every day.

Children in Year 1 are expected to record a minimum of 4 reads each week for at least 15 minutes. When your child reads at home, please ensure you write in their Monkey reading record book.

Monkey reading records will be checked by teachers every Friday for your child to move up the reading rainbow.

Maths

Each week your child should complete numbots for 15 minutes which can be accessed via <https://play.numbots.com/#/intro> . Your child's log-in is in their Monkey Reading Record. ***This will be checked every Friday.***

Spellings

Each week your child should compete Teach Your Monster to read for a minimum of 15minutes which can be accessed via <https://www.teachyourmonstertoread.com>. Your child's log-in is in their Monkey Reading Record. ***This will be checked every Friday.***

Optional Topic Project

We offer this optional topic-based homework for any children who wish to enhance and challenge their learning at home and for parents who would like their child to complete additional learning-based work.

Our topic this term is **Castles and Dragons**
