






Ask your children to copy the sentence below into their Home Learning Book. Then underline the SUBJECT in each sentence.

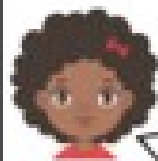
1. Suddenly the cup was knocked over.
