

Year 2 Spring Term Homework Expectation

Outlined below are the homework expectations for this half term.

Reading

Research shows that the more exposure your child has to reading, the more academically able they will be. We recommend and encourage all children to read or be read to every day.

Children in Year 2 are expected to record a minimum of 4 reads each week for at least 15 minutes. When your child reads at home, please write this into their Monkey Book Reading Record.

Monkey Books will be checked every Friday. If your child has read 4 times, they will be moved up the Reading Rainbow.

Maths

Each week your child should complete their Numbots assignments. Your child's log-in is stuck in their Monkey Book Reading Record.

Spellings

Your child will have a weekly assignment scheduled on Spelling Shed. Please ensure they complete three games within this assignment.

What?	Research a famous mountain or volcano	Present some information about what life is like in a Volcanic region	Create a model of a mountain or volcano	Draw or make a habitat for an animal that might live in an Alpine habitat.
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How?	Create a poster that includes some facts about your chosen Monarch	Create a PowerPoint or poster showing some facts what life is like in a volcanic region.	Use junk and other materials to create your own mountain or volcano.	Research what animals live in an Alpine habitat and draw or make its habitat.
