Spotlight on Attendance

Each newsletter we will report on a different aspect of school attendance and how we can support you in making 'everyday count' for your child.

Each week pupils have been celebrating good attendance in school by being awarded a trophy during assembly. It is getting very exciting to find out which class have won and the children are very proud of themselves.

Whole school attendance for the whole year is presently: 94.5%.

This half term our classes average attendance is:

Something to celebrate!

Our school has promoted attendance and celebrated the achievements made by our pupils.

Worryingly, at the start of the year approximately 20% of our pupils were 'Persistent absentees' which meant they had 90% or below school attendance. This was above the national average for PA and a concern. Thanks to all the hard work by parents and pupils, we have reduced this to 14.1% of pupils being considered 'Persistent Absentees'.

Why does this matter?

Being persistently absent (which the DFE defines as attendance 90% or below) and missing school can have negative impacts on pupils' outcomes including educational attainment, wellbeing and wider attainment.

Let's keep it up and we will be able to be sure that 'Everyday counts' for your child next year.

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School Uniform Reminder

We continue to pay particular attention to setting and maintaining the high standards that we are proud of at Cromwell Academy- this includes high standards of presentation in both uniform and work. As normality resumes, we wish to take this opportunity to reinforce the uniform expectations and expect that, as much as possible, these high expectations will be back in place following this period of difficulty.



Children are expected to be suitably dressed for the variety of indoor and outdoor activities in school.

Our school uniform is outlined below:

Black sweatshirt/cardigan

White polo shirt

Grey or black trousers or skirt

Sensible black shoes (**no trainers please**)

Plain black or grey tights / Black, grey or white socks

Optional Summer Variations

Grey or black shorts

Blue gingham dress

Only **small stud earrings** are allowed to be worn in school. **Please remove earrings on PE days before school. Children will not be allowed to participate in PE if they cannot remove their own earrings.** If you plan to have your child's ears pierced, we strongly urge you to arrange this for the start of the 6-week summer holiday so that this does not impact on participation in PE.

We encourage all of our students to take pride in their uniform and to have a high standard of personal appearance. We also encourage them to take responsibility for their own appearance. They should always help to create a positive first impression of the school both within and outside the school. We believe that our uniform is smart and practical to wear and we will always endeavour to provide the best value for money.

All hair that is below shoulder length or that covers the eyes should be tied back during the school day.

Extreme hairstyles and/or accessories are not permitted in school. Please avoid elaborate hair accessories that may distract pupils during their learning.

Your support as parents /carers is critical in enabling us to uphold the policy consistently and effectively to ensure the highest of standards.



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Important Reminders

IF YOUR CHILD IS ABSENT FROM SCHOOL PLEASE RING THE SCHOOL OFFICE AND LEAVE A MESSAGE ON THE ABSENCE LINE BY 8.50 AM AT THE LATEST. ABSENCE NEEDS TO BE REPORTED EVERY DAY

We open our school gates in the morning at 8.40am but it has been reported that some pupils are outside the gates as early as 8.00am. During this time, they are unsupervised and behaviour is becoming a concern. Please monitor how early your child is leaving the house to reduce the 'hanging about' near the road

*Please remember that **doors open at 8.40 and close promptly at 8.50**. Once classroom doors have been closed, you will not be permitted onto site and will be directed to the office entrance. This is to ensure all children are registered correctly for school meals and safeguarding purposes.*

Only **small stud earrings** are allowed to be worn in school. PLEASE REMOVE EARRINGS ON PE DAYS **BEFORE** COMING TO SCHOOL

Please remember to update any changes to telephone/mobile numbers, addresses and any medical information via Arbor.

For reasons of safety and courtesy, a further polite request for parents not to park in any of the hospital car parks, in front of residents driveways, on the double yellow lines or in congested areas around the school entrances.


