

## **Year 5 Summer Term Homework Expectation**

Outlined below are the homework expectations for this half term.

### **Reading**

Research shows that the more exposure your child has to reading, the more academically able they will be. We recommend and encourage all children to read or be read to every day.

Children in Year 5 are expected to record a minimum of 4 reads each week for at least 15 minutes. When your child reads at home, please ensure you write your initials on their bookmark.

***Bookmarks will be checked by teachers every Friday.***

### **Spellings**

Spellings will be set on Spelling shed or in a spelling book – according to your child's group. This is to be completed each week online.

***Spellings will be set on a Friday.***

### **Maths**

Each week your child should complete 10 Garage sessions and a soundcheck on Times table Rock stars which can be accessed via <https://trockstars.com/>.

***This will be checked every Friday.***

### **Homework Catch Up**

There will be an opportunity for children to catch up on any missed homework on a Friday lunch time.

### **Optional Topic Project**

We offer this optional topic-based homework for any children who wish to enhance and challenge their learning at home and for parents who would like their child to complete additional learning-based work.
