#### Year One Summer Term Homework Expectation

The impact of homework activities on learning in school ensure clearer expectations are set so that parents can facilitate the homework more easily, whilst providing greater independence for the children.

## **Reading**

Research shows that the more exposure your child has to reading, the more academically able they will be. We recommend and encourage all children to read or be read to every day.

Children in Year One are expected to record a minimum of **4 reads** each week for at least **10 minutes**. Reading at home must be **recorded in the reading diary with a parent signature**. If your child has read at least 4 times within the week (**evidenced by 4 parent signatures**) they will move up the 'Reading Rainbow' and at the end of the term will receive a reading prize for their hard work.

Reading books will be checked by teachers every Friday and new books given out (if the previous ones have been read). Children will also receive an additional reading book to take home and read for pleasure.

### **Spellings**

Spellings will be given to children either on Spelling Shed or on Teach Your Monster to Read.

Practise your phonics on <u>https://www.teachyourmonstertoread.com</u> using your username and password.

Spellings will be set each week either on Teach your Monster to Read or on Spelling Shed.

## <u>Maths</u>

For Maths you will be provided with activities to help with your child's number work for you to play and practise at home. The more practice your child has the more it will aid their learning in school. You can practice the Number Bonds Challenge with your child – ask them about it, they will know exactly what to do!
